

## KIT REVIEW

The Hottest new release from Kyosho is the 1:10 IC powered Inferno 10......

he Inferno 10 answers all the questions that Ripmax (the UK Kyosho importer) are asked by their customers. The car is basically a 1:10 scale car, four wheel drive that will go fast and look good! Ripmax are continually asked for cars that are faster than 1:10 electrics with longer running times, the Inferno 10 answers that and comes in a form that will suit everyone – with no engine included so that you can either fit one you already have or buy one of the new Kyosho engines that will fit into the car easily.












The original Kyosho 1:10 gas car – the RS200 was excellent, the only problems with it were a fragile pull start and engine and a complicated drive system that although was reliable featured gears, belts and all that was far to complicated. With their new Inferno 10 the problems have been addressed and packaged in the nicest looking Kyosho release for a long while....

## The new look

The Inferno 10 has a really nice look to the finished model, the chassis is anodized a really deep purple colour and this is the main base of the car, a silver top plate and shock bracket at each end finish off the alloy parts of the car and with the yellow wheels and moulded rear wing (developed for the World Championships) the car really looks as though it means business.

The car is basically designed around many of the already seen Kyosho 4WD parts, the drive system starts in the centre with a 1:8 style centre gear that drives directly from the clutch bell on the engine, the drive then (after passing through the disc brake) is taken to each end via driveshafts to a simple pinion and spur in each gearbox, this then via the diffs powers the driveshafts to the wheels – simple!

The Inferno 10 does come with some ballraces but not all, these can be easily obtained and is a good idea as the car will be fast and therefore will wear the kit bearings. The car is fitted with a new moulded fuel tank that is designed with a priming valve to get the fuel round to the engine, this

make for easier starting, the tank also has a flip top lid to aid fast top ups – the car though, as with any IC car should not be run continuously as they can get too hot, just a few tank fulls at a time.

The car also comes with alloy engine mounts, these fit a varied engine range and the car is also drilled to suit the Kyosho direct engine mounts to be found on the new Kyosho engines.

As with all Kyosho kits the cars are easy to build and simple to set up, the Inferno 10 is no exception and it seems Kyosho are ever improving their instruction manuals as this kit seems easier than ever to construct.

Car is fitted with Medium H pattern tyres that are a good all round dirt/ tarmac tyre. Below; Flip top fuel tank with priming valve.

## \* To suit you?

Overall the Inferno 10 does
answer a lot of requests and in a
way that will surely suit many RC car
fans, lots of the parts will already be
in the possession of potential
buyers as the suspension is from
the Mid range of cars, there is
though something about this car, it
looks right and feels right, and that
is often the difference between
buying or not buying – this car should
sell very well in the UK.

As you will see from the photos
the Inferno 10 has a lexan moulded
off road body, this is a little unusual
for IC but we at the RCMC offices
liked its tough, rugged looks. This
together with the wing and wheel
colours and the design of the paint
scheme makes the Inferno 10 in our
opinion one of the neatest cars now
on the market.
