Beside that I destroyed my real car in a traffic accident. Luckily I was unhurt, but my car was heavily damaged. Although I was not

responsible, it really didn't help to bring me into a better mood. So I decided to take some days off after I finished my work for the Impulse. I spent these free days with my girlfriend to celebrate Christmas and New Year. But I could not resist spending one Sunday at an indoor facility to have some fun with an Impact. When I came back to work, I

found that I had to do some redesigning of some parts of the Impulse, for example the chassis plate. We planned to make this chassis from 2mm aluminium in an extruding process. But after we analysed it, we found that it will be only a little cheaper than a classic

chassis-plate. So we decided to make the chassis plate from 7076-T6 aluminium with a thickness of 3mm, very much like the Impact-chassis. We think that in this way we can provide a much better quality and stiffness, which we also improved by adding two stiffeners between the radio-plate and the rear end. On the photos you can see the parts.


In between I got the new transmitter from Sanwa. As most of you know I use a Sanwa radio for quite a long time now, and I really like the new features of the SuperEXZES. The way I drive, I need two 'wings' to support my hands, and I have made a very, very nice part of it.
